When logging on to the online version of the database you will therefore be asked to accept the new EULAs where ecoinvent replaces Empa (Swiss Federal Laboratories for Material Science and Technology) as contract holder.

Coming updates, and renew your maintenance

The release of ecoinvent version 3.1 and the new system model are getting closer and we are hard at work to bring them to you soon. The new version 3.1 will feature numerous improvements, for example:

- ⇒ Complete sector update of the wood sector including also data on new products
- ⇒ New and updated data on road freight transport with current emission profiles
- ⇒ New Global and Canadian datasets on e.g. chemicals, metals and other basic industries
- ⇒ Smaller corrections and additions to the database

In addition, this spring will bring an additional system model that follows the cut-off or "Recycled Content" approach for recycling materials and waste treatment by-products. This approach was already used in the ecoinvent version 2 database.

All these updates and developments are **included** in your first year of maintenance. To continue to profit and gain access to future updates of the ecoinvent database, update your maintenance now.
